

## Book 16: Good Food and Drink To scale for 1:12 / 1" scale dollhouse




### Required tools and supplies:

- X-acto knife and fresh blade and detailing scissors
- A thin metal straight-edge ruler. Make fold lines by pressing against edge of the ruler.
- Tweezers
- Good cutting mat (cardboard will ruin your blades and project)
- Fast-grab, quick-dry white craft glue that dries clear
- Small piece of aluminum foil to use as a glue pot
- Slender artist's paint brush to apply glue
- Acid-free glue stick
- Optional: 1/2" paper punch. It really helps to make the finished project look professional!




1. Cut out cheese box disks. If you have one, use a 1/2" paper punch with the catch cover removed.



2. Use a pen or pencil to roll the cheese box side. Glue end at the line shown here. You can use the glue stick or craft glue with paint brush. The brush is much easier to control.




3. Paint glue to the top edge of the coil and then place the top disk in place. When dry, repeat for the bottom disk.




4. Baguette bag: Fold as shown in photo.



5. Paint glue to the top surface of the long tab labeled "tab".



6. Press the "tab" surface to the underside of the bag's other side. Press with the tweezers. Make sure the inside remains unglued. I used a nail file to loosen up wayward glue.



7. Use glue stick or painted glue to inside of bag tab.



8. Fold tab over bag bottom opening and press.

**Note:** Wine bottles for labels can be found on-line. Look for 1:12 scale or 1" dollhouse scale.





### Recipe Pouch:

1. Crease at all logical folds using a straight-edge ruler. Use the photo as a guide.
2. Glue the little tabs at the base and the tabs along the sides to the inside of the pouch.
3. The Pouch should look like this.



4. Cut the recipe cards. These do fit in the pouch, but may be staged otherwise.



### Mixing Bowls:

1. Roll bowl piece around the barrel of a pen, pencil or blade tool. This gives the bowl a good even shape.



2. Glue side tab.



3. Glue bowl circle base inside bowl, then glue circle base on the underside of bowl.



### Food Cans:

1. Roll can body around a barrel such as a paint brush handle.



2. Glue end and remove from cylinder. If you have a light gray felt tip pen, you will want to cover the raw white paper edge at the top and base of the can cylinder.



3. Glue ends to cans.



### Boxed Products:

1. Cut boxes then use a thin metal edged ruler to fold against and create perfect creases.
2. Use the paint brush and fast grab, quick dry craft glue to paint glue along the box's side tab.
3. Close up the ends and glue shut.



### Flour and Sugar Bag:

1. Cut and fold bag as shown here.



2. Glue the side seam. Use tweezers to press the bond.



3. Glue the front and back pointed panels. There are four in all. See the second photo here for details...



The glued edges do not need to be perfect, as demonstrated here.



4. Overlap the two squared-off tabs and glue into place. Repeat for similar tabs on bottom of bag.



5. Glue down pointed tabs on both the top and bottom of bag. You may need to hold these tabs in place while they dry.





1. Roll a log of white modeling compound.



2. Cut into chunks for individual marshmallows.



3. Roll marshmallows into proper shape.



4. Take sheet plastic such as a zip lock sandwich bag and cut to pattern.



5. Cut out bag label and tape to center of cut sheet plastic. Use crystal clear tape for this and the next steps.



6. Roll back bag and tape for back seam.



7. Carefully tape bottom of bag. Then fill with marshmallows.


1. Cut and fold carton as shown here. The milk carton is assembled in the same manner. If you are unsure of yourself and want a practice piece first, merely trace the unit on plain paper before cutting pieces. Make a practice unit with the plain trace.



2. Glue the side tab and press bond using tweezers as shown here.



3. Glue the four tabs found on the bottom of the carton. Allow all glue to dry thoroughly before proceeding to the next step.



4. Position the inner panels as shown here in the photo. Place a layer of glue to the inner blank surface of the strip that has the word "OPEN" printed on it.



5. Press the glue to the opposite panel and glue tight with help from the tweezers. The inner panels will stay in place. Hold until the glue has pretty much dried. The carton is complete.



**Pizza Take Out:**

3. Blend connection and make realistic imperfections such as lumps and bumps. Allow to dry. Then trim around the paper if shrinkage exposes the "pizza" under the "crust."



4. Use a semi-dry paint brush and brush/blend Folk Art #419 Teddy Bear Tan on crust. Highlight with darker Folk Art #476 Asphaltum.



1. Roll a log of white modeling compound. I used Crayola Model Magic.



5. Paint glue to under side of crust and adhere to paper pizza.



2. Place roll around printed pizza



**Assembly for Small Pops:**

1. Take bead-headed straight pins and clip the pins to the desired length.
2. Take a short strip of sticky label and wrap remaining pin to the desired thickness.
3. Glue wrapper at center as shown above. Allow to dry.
4. Work wrapper around bead. It will take much massaging to make the paper pliable.
