

**book20 ~ The Cabbage Roses Millinery  
1:12 dollhouse scale**



**Requires**

- X-acto knife and fresh blade
- A thin metal straightedge ruler. Make fold lines by pressing against edge of the ruler.
- Small detailing scissors and tweezers
- Good cutting mat. Cardboard will ruin your blade and your project.
- Fast-grab, quick-dry white craft glue that dries clear
- An acid-free glue stick
- Small piece of aluminum foil to use as a glue pot
- Slender flat artist's paintbrush to apply glue
- Plastic and metal bonding glue for perfume bottles

**Lined Round Hat Boxes**

1. Cut out pieces. Kit hat boxes and candy box no longer have the mismatched rose borders.

**Note:** Products in tutorial may look different from yours, but are constructed identically to yours.



2. Roll side pieces around a pen like item. This gives the hat box a nice curve to it.



3. Cut along lining panel's ribs.




4. Fold tabs and lining panels along straight edge ruler. I have the ruler secured with clamps.



5. Glue side tab on box to make a cylinder. Do the same for the lid. Paint glue with a brush. Use the quick-grab, fast-dry craft glue.



6. Fold down and glue lining panels to interior of box. A glue stick may work more easily for you.



7. Repeat step for lid.



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
8. Glue inside round disks into box and lid. This will keep the shape of the hat box perfectly round. Make certain first that the disks fit and do not need trimming.




9. Glue bottom panel in place with brush.




10. Glue top panel in place with brush.



4. Take the ribbon and create a figure "8" pattern on the two nails. Three loops per side is the size this tutorial uses.



5. When you are done making figure "8s", secure the tail end of the ribbon by poking it on the right side's tack.



6. Next, slip the first ribbon from it's tacks, and tie a tight knot at the center point of the bow. The bow is now complete and you can remove it from the other two tacks. Slide the bow from the nail shafts. Don't cut the tails until you know for certain how much you need to secure the bow.




### Desk Caddy

1. Fold the main piece of the desk caddy at all fold lines. You will see a box shape appear when folds are in place.
2. Use the artist's brush and paint glue to side tabs found on box shape. Use tweezers to press down glued seams.
3. Fold down and glue the lining panels found at the top perimeter edge. This gives the top edges a finished appearance.

### Bow Maker

This works for both the hat boxes and stationery caddy.


1. Glue the tacks and nails as shown with heavy duty glue. The nails are about 3/4" apart. The nails do not need to be the same length, as you can see from this sample.



2. Center the first piece of 1/16" ribbon and poke onto tacks as shown. This piece will tie around the middle of the bow to hold it secure. You can make this piece any length you desire.





3. Next take the end of another ribbon and poke onto the left tack as shown.



4. Take the base piece. Fold in half and glue blank sides together. Center panel under box bottom and glue into place.

### Envelope

1. Fold the four triangle sides.
2. The bottom triangle is folded up first. Remove the card.
3. Place a drop of glue placed at it's tip.
4. Fold the two side triangles against it.
5. If the glue slips and dries to the inside of the envelope, use a blade tool to open the envelope.







## Shoe Box



1. Cut and fold pieces.



2. Glue corner tabs



3. Secure Tabs with tweezers.



4. Paint glue to interfacing panels and fold inward. Press tightly with tweezers.




## Shopping Bag

1. Cut out all pieces. Fold handles lengthwise along fold lines--triple thick.




2. Glue the entire length of each handle so that the end result is two long, fully lined handles.

**Not shown:** After the handles dry, roll handles around shafted tool such as a pen or pencil. This will help you get a natural curve to your handle.




3. Take first handle and glue end to blank inner surface of the bag. See the tic marks on the printed side for handle positioning. Allow to dry.

4. Glue the other end of handle when first position has dried. Repeat these steps for other side.



5. Fold bag piece against straight edge to get nice creases. Slather a layer of glue to the long side tab. Use tweezers to press bond between tab and side of bag.

6. Place glue to two small tabs on bottom of bag. Press long non-logo panel to them.






- Place glue to non-logo side and press logo side to it.



### Tissue Bag Stuffer

- Tissue panel should be approximately 12-18 times the width of the bag and 2.5 times the bag height.



- Take tissue and fold lengthwise. make one side slightly wider than the other, unlike the photo.



- Fan-fold length of doubled tissue.



- Staple base of fan-fold length.



- Separate folded halves of tissue to create fluff and volume.



- Place tissue in bag part way.
- Use a toothpick to gently press down stuffing into the bag, so as not to smash the fluff.



### Hand Fan and Matchbox Storage

What you will need to gather up: An optional 1/16" paper hole punch, contrasting embroidery floss, black office binder clip, large-eyed needle, and toothpick.




- Pull off three long strand of the embroidery floss and set aside. Cut the remaining piece into 3, 2" lengths. Note: for doll scale make the strands a little longer



- Fold the three lengths in half and pinch into the black binder clip. The folded center should be exposed.



- Take one of the long strands and tie together at the center of the fold. It is easier to handle if you thread it with the needle and then do the work.



- Now take the rest of the threaded strand and tie around the bundle to make a tassel head.

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5. Take the toothpick and use it to separate and untwist the strands.




6. Snip the bottom ends of the tassel to make a nice clean straight line.



7. Cut out eight of the paddles. If you have a 1/16" paper hole punch, then punch out the hole at the base of each paddle. Otherwise, use a blade tool to cut the holes.



8. Stack the paddles. Use the toothpick to guide the strand found at the top of the head of the tassel through the holes.



9. Tie the two ends together.



10. Clip the paddles together with the binder clip. Use a piece of cardboard to protect the paddles against the binder clip. Thread one of the long strands on a needle and sew paddles together fairly tightly. The point is to make it tight enough that when you open the fan it will stay open, but loose enough that you can open the fan.



11. The photo should be guidance to show you how far to open the fan.




12. To make the slide-lid fan box, cut out the 3 pieces. Take the cover, fold as shown and glue long tab to the inner blank surface. Use the slender flat artist's paint brush to apply the glue evenly.



13. Take the box piece and fold as shown.



14. Paint glue to the corner tabs and press to the inner blank surface of the respective sides. Take the tweezers and pinch the corners for a good tight bond.



15. There is a loose panel on each box side. These are linings for the box sides. Fold down, and glue into place inside the box.



16. The last piece is the rectangle to be used as the bottom lining. Glue into place.



17. Slide the box into the cover.

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
### Candy Box

1. Glue the side tabs to the respective sides for both the box top and box bottom.
2. Fold the top panel in half and glue blank sides together.
3. Fold the bottom panel in half and glue blank sides together.
4. Glue the top panel to the top of the box and glue the bottom panel to the bottom of the box.
5. If you make your own candy, use the doily box insert as shown in the photo. If not, use the box insert with the printed candy. Use a clear dimensional paint to give the paper candy realism.



### Clutch Portfolio

1. Cut out the piece and fold at the logical joints. Use the metal straight-edge ruler to make folds.
2. Once folded, there are two side pieces that have 3 panels. The two outer panels are tabs. Paint glue to the printed surface of the two outer tabs. Do this on both sides of the clutch box.
3. Use tweezers and press tight, flat bonds of the tabs to the respective inner blank surfaces of the clutch box.
4. Carefully fold the lid down. Cut a length of ribbon, about 6 inches. At the center of the back of the



clutch box, paint a very thin strip of glue. The ribbon will be glued down to that strip of glue. Place the middle point of the ribbon to the middle point of the glue strip.



5. Once the ribbon's glue has dried thoroughly, you may tie a bow at the front of the clutch box.

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### Flat Gift Box

1. Create a bottom open box by glueing the side tabs to the respective blank inner sides.
2. So the same for the lid.
3. Take the loose back flap of the top and glue to outside surface of the box bottom's back side. This "hinges" the box open and close.



### Sachet Packets

1. Cut and fold as shown in the below photo.
2. Fold down the back of the packet.
3. Glue the three tabs over the back of the packet.
4. Stack the three packets and wrap with the band. Glue the band in place.





### French Bar Soap Stack Boxes

1. Cut and fold pieces to logically form shape of bar soap boxes.
2. Glue the long side tab to the blank interior surface of a box.
3. Fold down the three plain tabs, paint glue to the blank inner surface of the forth panel and press shut.
4. Repeat for the other two boxes.
5. Put a drop of glue in between each box in the stack and allow to dry.
6. Tie ribbon around stack.



3. Fold piece to form a box.



4. Glue the long side tab to the blank interior of the box. Glue the bottom flaps closed.



### Round Faux Containers

1. Roll long panel to the beginning of the design and glue end in place to keep from unfurling. Feel free to roll on something such as a B-B-Q skewer.
2. Glue lid and bottom on the appropriate tube (you may want to gilt the outer edge before hand).
3. You can make handles for these containers with either a nice bead or paint a BB gold, as in the photo.



5. Use the tip of the X-acto blade tool and slide it into the box and thread it through the two slits on the front of the box (you are not to cut anything during this step). Carefully press that panel to the back of the box. This creates the display area for the perfume bottle.

6. Slip the bottle of perfume in to the box and tuck in top box flap.



### Perfume Boxes

1. Cut out the box piece.
2. Cut slits along the lengths of the two horizontal markings found on the front of the box.



### Toiletries

1. Follow the photos for assembling bottle and puff. Use your imagination and use what you have on hand.
2. Use bonding glue for fittings and baubles.
3. Cut pins with wire cutters if necessary. Be careful not to let cut end fly.



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
