


bookb1: Lincoln Stamp Album for 1:12 Dollhouse Scale



Required tools and supplies:

- ! X-acto knife and fresh blade(s)
- ! A thin metal straightedge ruler. Make fold lines by pressing against edge of the ruler.
- ! Tweezers and detailing scissors
- ! Good cutting mat (cardboard will ruin your blades *and* project)
- ! Fast-grab, quick-dry white craft glue that dries clear
- ! Small piece of aluminum foil to use as a glue pot
- ! Flat artist brush for applying glue and small water container.
- ! Office binder clips




The Lincoln Stamp Album Assembly



1. Cut out the page strips. Fan fold all page strips taking care that the raw edges line up perfectly. Notice in the photo that the pages of maps are not folded nor are the panels in back of those maps. They will stick out from the normal sized pages to the end of the tutorial.



2. Use the glue stick to glue the little connecting panels to the back of the respective partner. You will end up with a long accordion strip.




3. Next, carefully add a layer of glue stick to the back side of the strip. You may wish to do a little at a time in conjunction with the next step. **DO NOT SPREAD GLUE TO BACKS OF END BOARDS!**

4. One-by-one, press the blank sides of the pages together. Be careful to align the raw edges of the pages as perfectly as possible.



5. Compress the stack of pages and pinch pages with the office clips leaving the spine side exposed. Use the artist's brush to paint a thick even coat of glue to the length of the pages along the spine. Set aside to dry thoroughly.



6. Cut out the cover piece using a blade tool. Cut the spine notches first.

7. Take the cover's lining panel and position it to the exact center of the inside of the book cover piece to ensure that the size is correct. Fold the perimeter tabs. Trim the lining if needed.

8. Paint a layer of glue to the interfacing piece. Then place the lining panel to the exact center of the cover.



9. Paint glue to the perimeter tabs and glue down to interfacing. Take care to pull the diagonal corner seams close to each other.


10. There are two guidelines on the cover's lining or on the outside of the book cover. These designate where the spine is to be. Use the edge of a ruler to fold at those guidelines.




11. Next take the stack of pages and position it inside the cover to ensure that the fit is good. Paint glue to the blank side of the 'end boards' and the spine. Use plenty of glue so it stays wet long enough for you to position the pages before a sticking bond occurs.

12. Position the unit carefully on the inside of the book cover. Flatten out edges.

13. When everything has dried, fold in the map pages.




bookb1: Our Travels Abroad Vintage Travel Emblem Album to Scale for 1:12 dollhouses



1. These instructions use photos for another book, but the construction is identical as the book included in your kit. Cut out the page strips. Fan fold all page strips taking care that the raw edges line up perfectly. There are little tab panels at one end of most panels, that are not shown in this photo. Those will be used to connect the panels together.

2. Use the glue stick to glue the little connecting panels to the back of its respective partner. You will end up with a long accordion.





5. Pinch the fan-folded pages in order and carefully line up the stack's perimeter edges. Pinch pages with the office clips leaving the spine side exposed. If you would like to prevent the clips from denting the book's pages, sandwich a lightweight piece of cardboard between the clips and the book. 
1. Some of the photos are of other books, but the assembly for your book is the same. Cut out the page strips. Fan fold all page strips taking care that the raw edges line up perfectly. There are little tab panels at one end of most panels. Those will be used to connect the panels together.



10. Carefully place the pages inside the book's cover and smooth bond.



11. Fold envelopes and secure the tabs with glue. Glue the envelopes in their respective place in the book. There are two extra envelopes for staging purposes.

bookb1: Family Photograph Album to Scale for 1" Dollhouses



1. Glue interfacing to inside of cover.
2. Fold cover's tabs over interfacing and glue tabs in place. Fold at the spine.
3. Accordion fold pages. Use glue stick to glue fronts to backs. **DO NOT GLUE END-BOARDS.**
4. Hold pages tightly with a binder clip. Now add strength to the spine by painting glue to edge of pages and allow the glue to dry.
5. Place the bundle of pages to inside of cover to determine proper fit.
6. Glue end boards to inside of cover.
