

# Bookfd3: Cookies and Candy Assembly Instructions for 1:6 scale for fashion dolls/play scale



## Required tools and supplies:

- X-acto knife and fresh blade. Projects can be cut with scissors if you prefer.
- A thin metal straightedge ruler can be used to make fold lines by pressing against edge of the ruler.
- Tweezers are good for holding and pressing glue bonds.
- A cotton swab is also a useful tool for pressing glue bonds.
- Use a good cutting mat. Cardboard used as a substitute cutting mat will ruin your blade and your project will have rough edges.
- The best glue to use is a fast-grab, quick-dry, white craft glue that dries clear. Regular craft glue is too soupy to be of help here.
- An acid-free glue stick comes in handy, but only use when specified.
- A small piece of aluminum foil makes a good disposable glue pot.
- A slender artist's paintbrush is a good tool to use to apply glue. Wash the brush in clear water when not in use. Some prefer to use a toothpick, but a brush will give you much more control.



Artwork in sample photos may not look the same, however, the assembly is identical.

## Recipe Pouch:

1. Crease at all logical folds using a straight-edge ruler. Use the photo as a guide.
2. Glue the little tabs at the base and the tabs along the sides to the inside of the pouch.
3. The Pouch should look like this.




## Mixing Bowls:



1. Roll bowl piece around the barrel of a pen, pencil or blade tool. This gives the bowl a good even shape.



2. Glue side tab.



3. Glue bowl circle base inside bowl, then glue circle base on the underside of bowl.



## Food Cans:

1. Roll can body around a barrel such as a paint brush handle.



2. Glue end and remove from cylinder. If you have a light gray felt tip pen, you will want to cover the raw white paper edge at the top and base of the can cylinder.



3. Glue ends to cans.



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### Flour and Sugar Bag:

1. Cut and fold bag as shown here.
2. Glue the side seam. Use tweezers to press the bond.

3. Glue the front and back pointed panels. There are four in all. See the second photo here for details...



The glued edges do not need to be perfect, as demonstrated here.

4. Overlap the two squared-off tabs and glue into place. Repeat for similar tabs on bottom of bag.

5. Glue down pointed tabs on both the top and bottom of bag. You may need to hold these tabs in place while they dry.



**S'mores Crackers and Chocolate Bars** instructions are found on project.



1. Roll a log of white modeling compound.

2. Cut into chunks for individual marshmallows.

3. Roll marshmallows into proper shape.

4. Take sheet plastic such as a zip lock sandwich bag and cut to pattern.

5. Cut out bag label and tape to center of cut sheet plastic. Use crystal clear tape for this and the next steps.

6. Roll back bag and tape for back seam.

7. Carefully tape bottom of bag. Then fill with marshmallows.






1. Cut and fold carton as shown here. The milk carton is assembled in the same manner. If you are unsure of yourself and want a practice piece first, merely trace the unit on plain paper before cutting pieces. Make a practice unit with the plain trace.



2. Glue the side tab and press bond using tweezers as shown here.



3. Glue the four tabs found on the bottom of the carton. Allow all glue to dry thoroughly before proceeding to the next step.



4. Position the inner panels as shown here in the photo. Place a layer of glue to the inner blank surface of the strip that has the word "OPEN" printed on it.



5. Press the glue to the opposite panel and glue tight with help from the tweezers. The inner panels will stay in place. Hold until the glue has pretty much dried. The carton is complete.

**NOTE:** Cookie sheet was painted with silver fingernail polish.



## Pops

Here's an easy way to make the pops on a stick.

Use beads of the appropriate size for your lollipops. The example photo shows three different scales. I'm using one of my favorite "tools" which is the sticky clay used to hang posters on walls. It doesn't work well for poster hanging, but it works great for holding parts in place as you paint or glue.



1. Take paper and roll tightly and glue to form lollipop sticks. Trim as necessary. Take a good bonding glue and glue sticks onto beads.

2. Place a dot of glue and glue bead head to center of lollipop wrapper. Allow to dry.



3. Samples are shown glued to wrappers.



4. This is a photo of the larger lollipops with the wrappers in place. It will take much massaging to make the paper pliable.

## ASSEMBLY FOR SMALL POPS:

Here's a more appropriate method for making very tiny lollipops.



1. Take bead-headed straight pins and clip the pins to the desired length.
2. Take a short strip of sticky label and wrap remaining pin to the desired thickness.
3. Glue wrapper at center as shown above. Allow to dry.
4. Work wrapper around bead. It will take much massaging to make the paper pliable.
