

Bookss6 ~ Let's Stock the Kitchen and Man's Best Friends for 1:12 or 1" dollhouse scale



Required tools and supplies:

- X-acto knife and fresh blade
- A thin metal straightedge ruler. Make fold lines by pressing against edge of the ruler.
- Small detailing scissors
- Good cutting mat. No cardboard, for it will ruin your project.
- Fast-grab, quick-dry white craft glue that dries clear
- Small piece of aluminum foil to use as a glue pot
- Slender flat artist's paintbrush to apply glue



Pie Box:

1. Cut out piece and fold accordingly.



2. Note how the triangular yellow panels are folded to lay flat against box top and bottom.
3. On the smaller scale pie boxes, you may want to snip the yellow triangular panels as shown. They will lay flat this way.
4. Glue the yellow triangular panels flat as shown. Then glue box side tab.
5. Glue box openings closed.

Food Cans:

1. Roll can body around a cylinder such as a paint brush handle. Glue edge and remove from cylinder.
2. Glue top and bottom to cans. Before gluing you might want to use a color gray pen to cover the raw white edge of the paper. This will give your pieces a nice finished look.



Boxed Products:

1. Cut boxes then use a thin metal edged ruler to fold against and create perfect creases.
2. Use the paint brush and fast grab, quick dry craft glue to paint glue along the box's side tab.
3. Close up the ends and glue shut.



Tea bags: Fold and glue bag shut. Cut short length of thread and glue one end to bag and the other to the tag.



Flour Bag:

1. Cut and fold bag as shown here.




2. Glue the side seam. Use tweezers to press the bond.



3. Glue the front and back pointed panels. There are four in all. See the second photo here for details...



The glued edges do not need to be perfect, as demonstrated here.



4. Overlap the two squared-off tabs and glue into place. Repeat for similar tabs on bottom of bag.



5. Glue down pointed tabs on both the top and bottom of bag. You may need to hold these tabs in place while they dry.



Cookie Bag:

1. Fold to make tall box.
2. Glue side tab.
3. Glue base shut.
4. Roll top of bag. Glue if necessary.



Gusset Bags:

1. Fold at gusset. It's folded to make a "W" shape.
2. Take a thin paint brush and paint glue along the side inner edges of the bag. Press and allow to dry.
3. Stuff bag with a little tissue to give it body.
4. Glue top of bag shut.



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
